SOL GROUP's commitment to environmental sustainability continues: obtained "B" rating on debut in the "CDP."

In July 2022, SOL Group participated for the first time in CDP (Carbon Disclosure Project)- an organization that measures the impact on the environment by companies, government agencies, cities and states - scoring "B" in the rating (from "A" to "F").

With data voluntarily shared by more than 15,000 companies worldwide, the CDP holds and manages the world's largest database for tracking corporate performance against climate change. The CDP assessment considers completeness of disclosure, awareness and management of environmental risks as well as demonstration of best practices associated with environmental leadership, including setting ambitious goals.

Participation in the CDP questionnaire represents a milestone of paramount importance in SOL's sustainability journey. Moreover, although this is only the first year of participation, the positive result obtained testifies to the fact that the Group's commitment and efforts to date on the sustainability side are also recognized and appreciated externally. Indeed, companies that score B have addressed the environmental impacts of their business and ensure good environmental management.

Several projects go in this direction: for example, among the most recent, the formulation of the Sustainability Plan that SOL is committed to implement by 2030, and the acquisition last December of a wind power generation field in India, with 6 GE turbines of 2.3 MW each subservient to renewable power generation for the Bangalore air fractionation plant.
